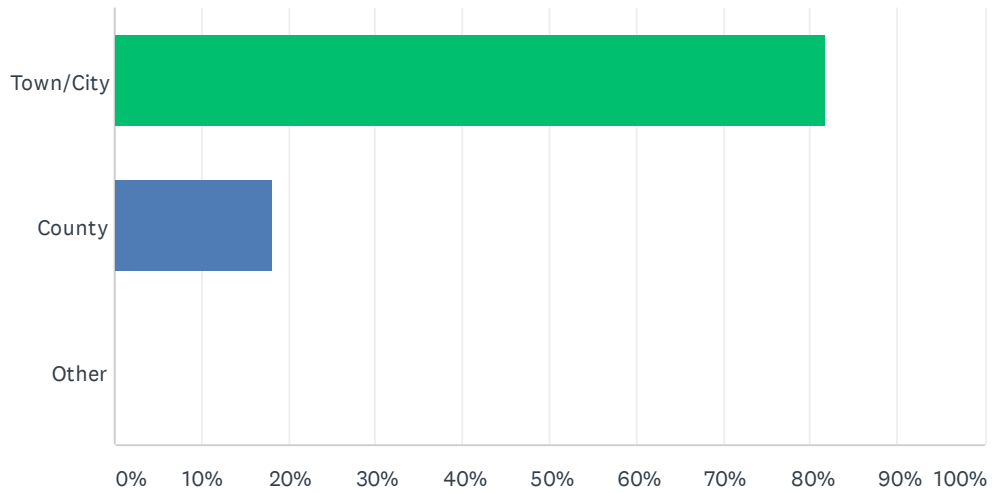


Q1 Do you represent a municipality or county?

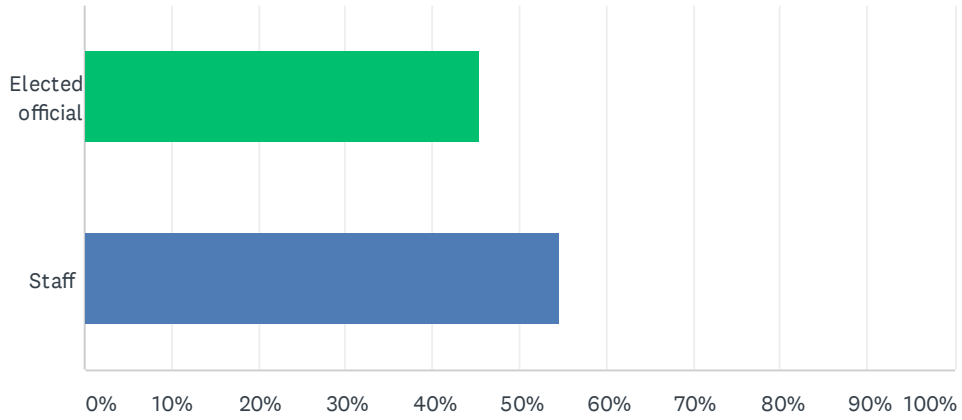

Q2 Are you an elected official or staff?

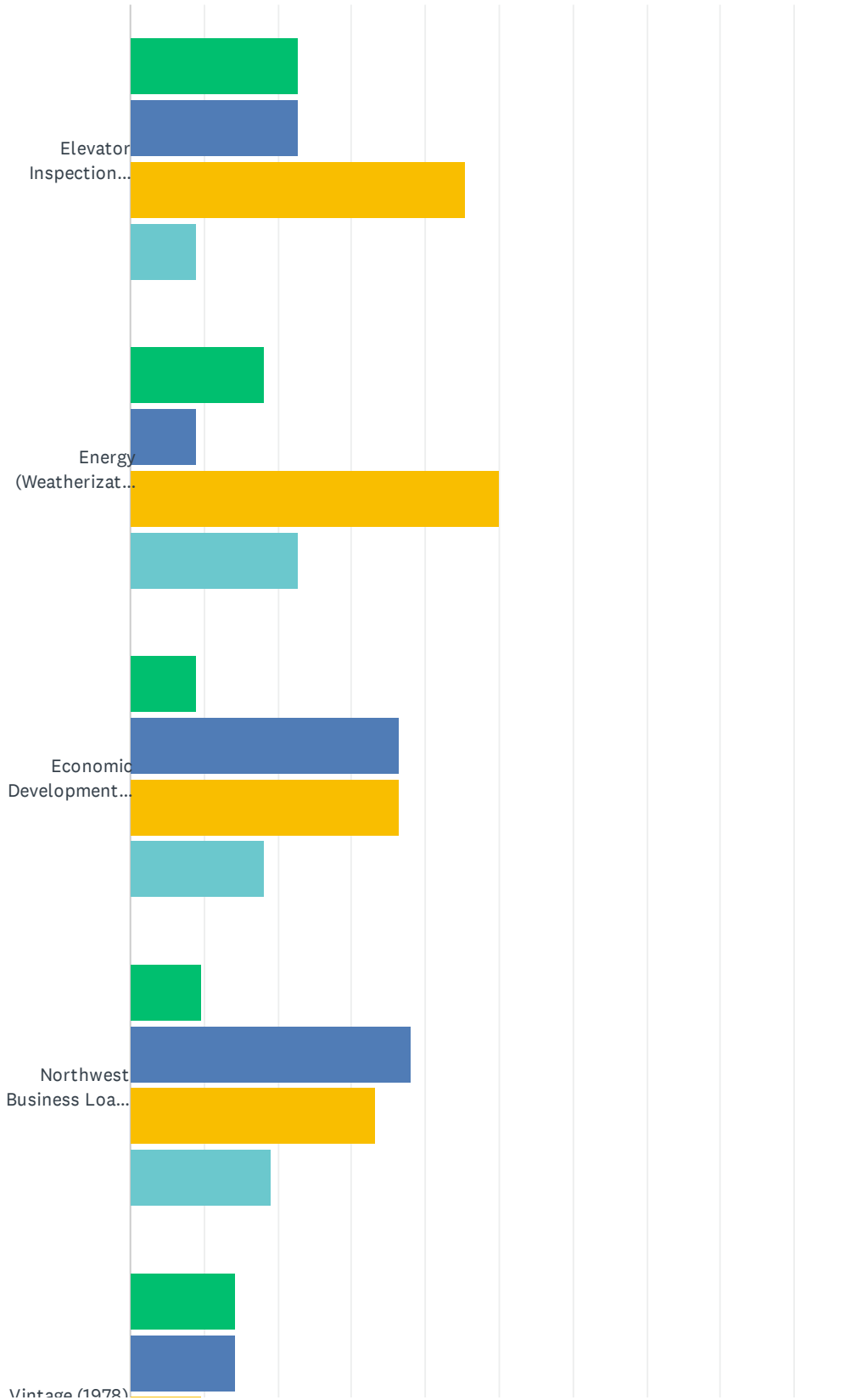

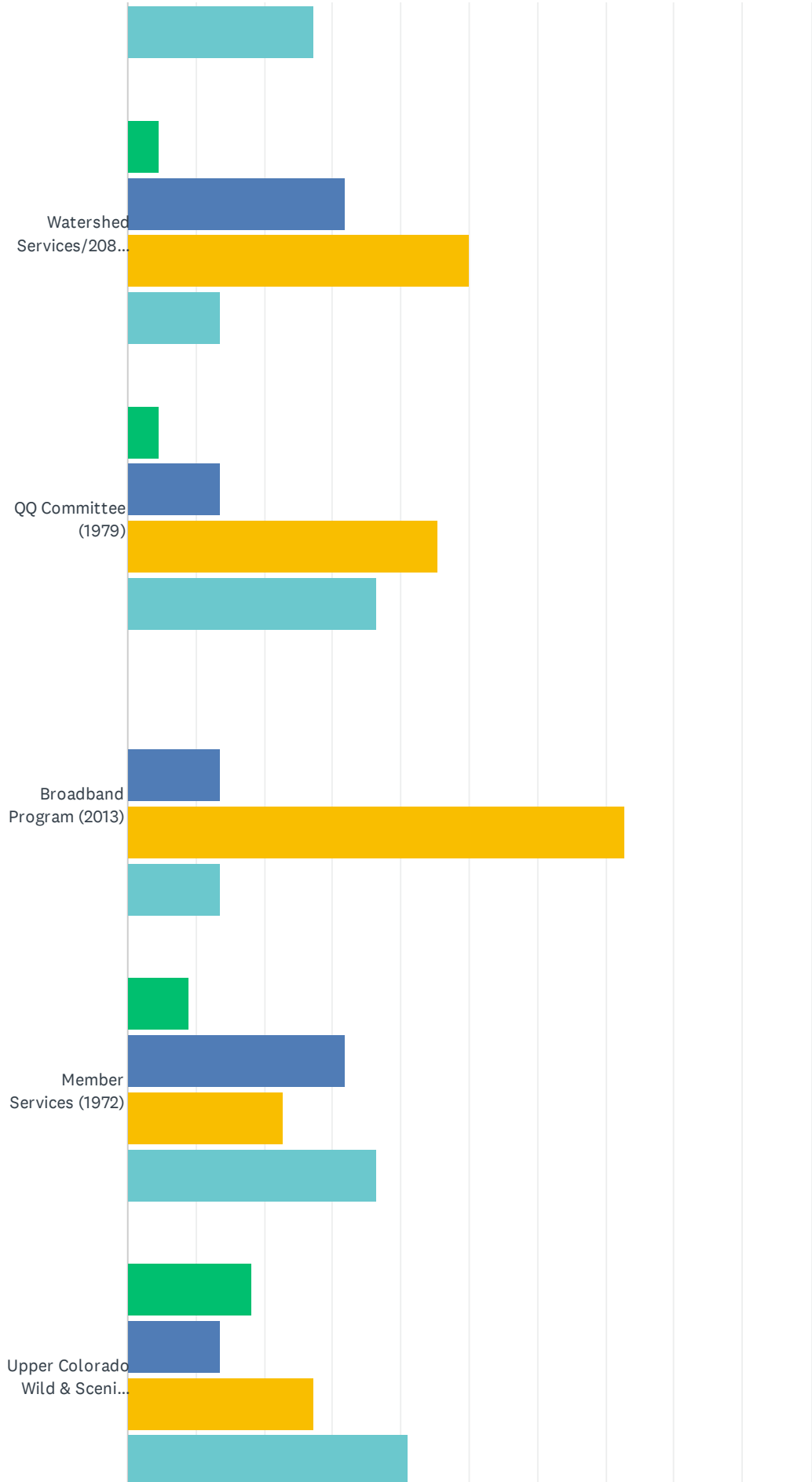

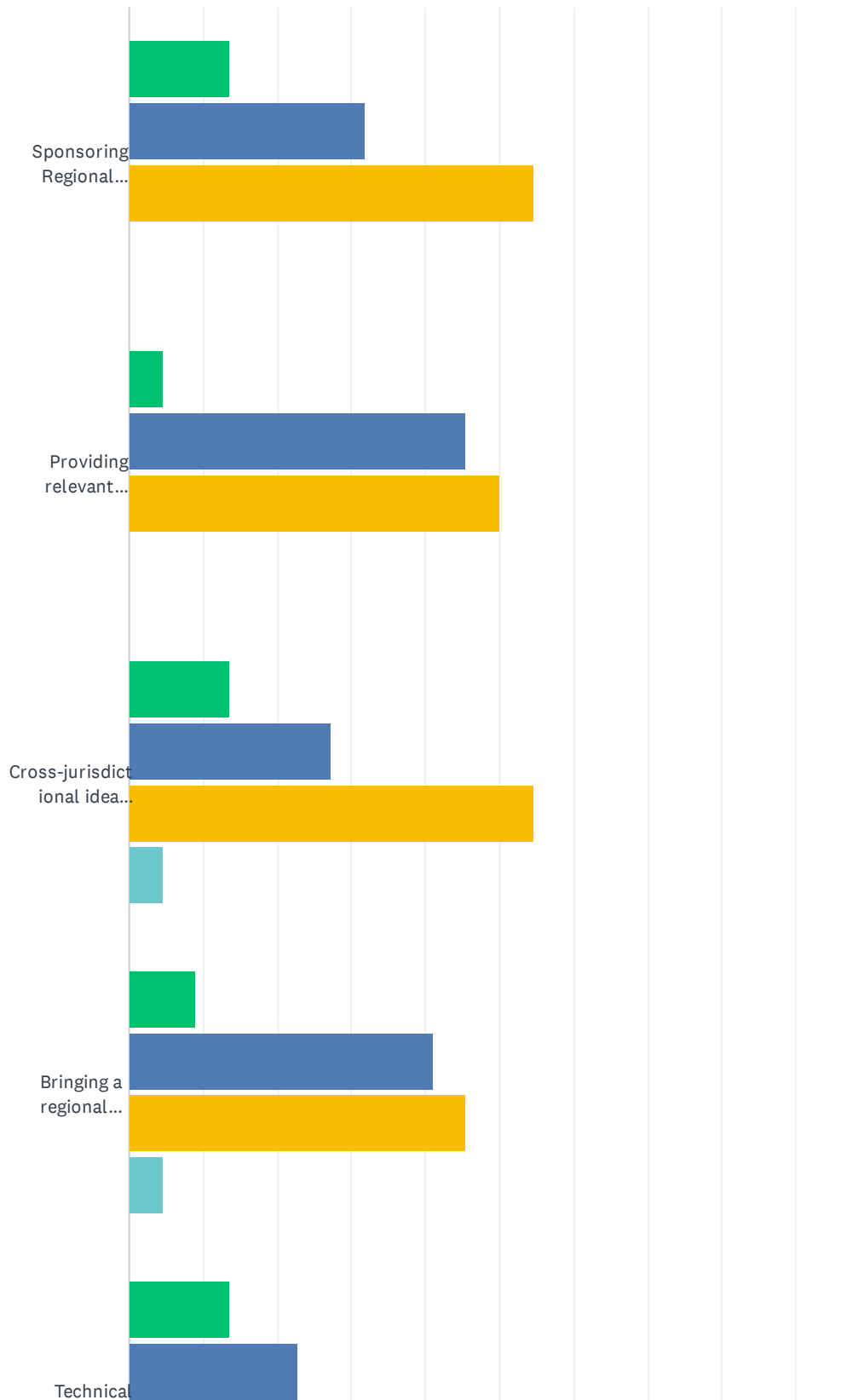

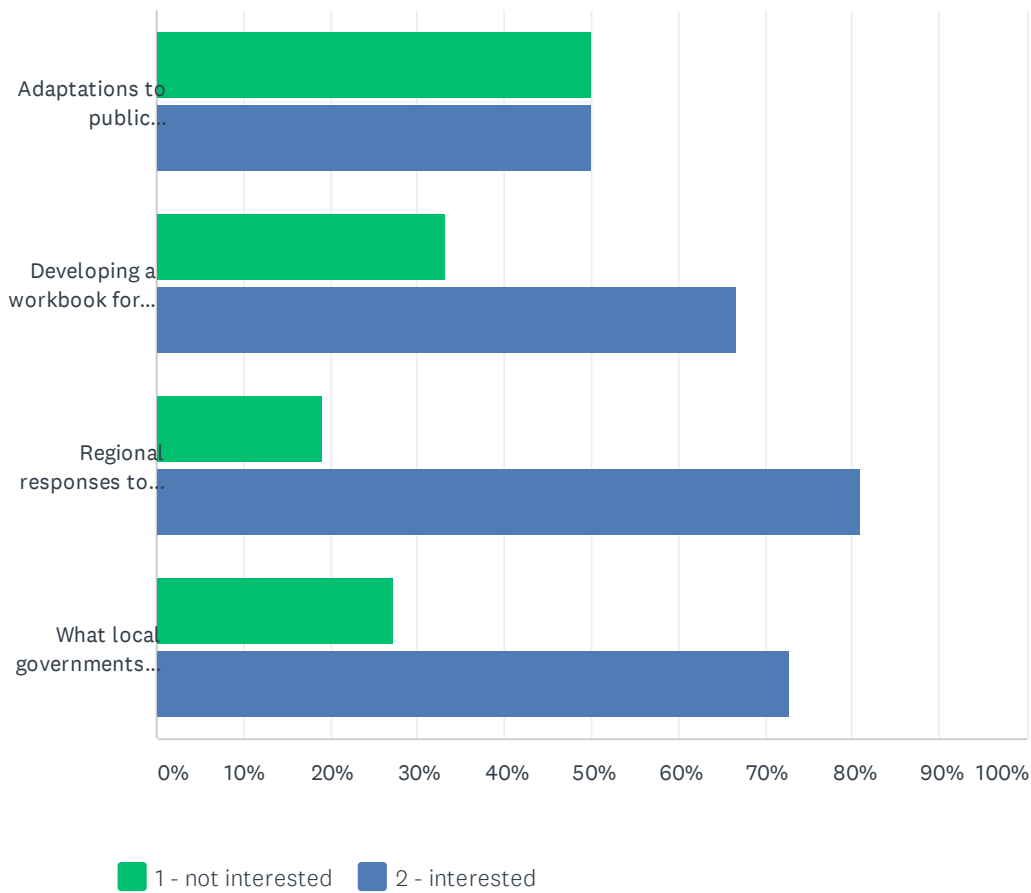
