RE: Recommendations

Dear Members of the Northwest Colorado Council of Governments Executive Committee and Council;

Background:

On December 8, 2011 the Northwest Colorado Council of Governments appointed a Hiring Committee for the Executive Director vacancy currently facing the organization. Persons appointed to the committee were: Commissioner Karn Stiegelmeier, Summit County; Commissioner Rob Ittner, Pitkin County; John Hoffmann, Trustee Town of Carbondale; June Walters, NWCCOG Director of Business and Economic Development and Greg Winkler, Regional Manager DOLA.

The Hiring Committee (HC) met on December 19, 2011 at the Mt. Royal Room, Summit County Commons in Frisco, Co. Committee members present were Commissioner Stiegelmeier, June Walters and Greg Winkler. Committee members present by phone were Commission Ittner and Trustee Hoffmann.

The HC reviewed Article VII of the NWCCOG By-Laws regarding the duties of the HC and it was agreed everyone understood the role as outlined. However, it was also agreed upon by the HC that this committee would provide information to the NWCCOG Executive Committee and Council as a series of recommendations re: determinations and actions to be taken in the hiring of a new executive director.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

Job Description:

There was discussion of the current position description and what changes should be made be in order to provide more clarity and understanding for both the ED, and the Executive Committee and NWCCOG Council. Information and recommendation for changes were provided by both Trustee Hoffmann and Commissioner Ittner and a reformat of the position description was suggested by Mr. Winkler.

Action Item:

Approve the revised position description for the Executive Director of the Northwest Colorado Council of Governments.

Hiring Scope and Process:

The HC requested and received advice from Barbara Green, NWCCOG Counsel regarding her interpretation of the role and responsibilities of the HC regarding the scope and process for the hiring of the executive director. Ms. Green's overarching advice was that this committee had a wide range of latitude for the advertising scope and process, that could range from an "in-house" only posting to a full "nationwide search". However, the committee was cautioned that any undue delay could result in increased opportunity to lose an institutionally knowledgeable and willing candidate. There were also cautions voiced from the previous NWCCOG meeting expressing a strong sentiment that hiring be done from within Colorado. There was a consensus of the members that a nationwide search should not be conducted due to a more than ample field of potential candidates from Colorado.

With that, the HC hereby recommends the following scope and process be used in the hiring of the new executive director;

The posting of the vacancy and a copy of the job description will be placed on the NWCCOG web-site, as well as on the websites of the National Association of Regional Councils (NARC), the National Association of Development Organizations (NADO), Colorado Municipal League (CML) and Colorado Counties, Incorporated (CCI).

The vacancy posting and job description strongly encourage Colorado experience and will be open from January 27, 2012 until February 10, 2012. The applicants will be required to submit electronically a letter of intent and a resume to edsearch@nwccog.org. The HC will screen the initial applicants by the last week in February.

It is the recommendation of the HC that the final interview process be conducted if at all possible in one day by the 15th of March, by the three groups listed below;

1) A group of council members not on the executive committee;

- 2) A group of staff members mixing both department heads and employees;
- 3) A group of Executive Committee members;

The first two groups will make a recommendation of their ranking of the selected candidates for final hiring consideration by the Executive Committee.

Based on timeline described above it is the HC's recommendation that a selection be made, an offer tendered and negotiated with the selected candidate prior to the NWCCOG's Board meeting on March 22, 2012. It is anticipated that at the meeting in March formal action by the Executive Committee and the Council can be taken to ratify the selection.

It should be noted that the HC did receive correspondence from the Grand County Board of County Commissioners supporting the appointment of the current interim director, Liz Mullen. We agree with their assessment of Ms. Mullen's capabilities, however, it is the collective opinion of the HC that the scope and process we have recommended allows Ms. Mullen to apply and participate in the process and still allows the organization to examine other candidates in an expeditious manner.

Action Item:

Approve recommendation.

Salary Range:

The HC reviewed the NWCCOG 2011 Salary Survey information that was prepared by the NWCCOG staff on September 9, 2011. It is a compilation of information on salaries from Mountain State Employers Council and CARO member organizations. The committee's focus was solely on the Executive Director's position and corresponding salary information.

There was discussion within the committee that the Executive Director's job duties are quite similar to that of a City or County Manager. The NWCCOG's departments and programs are much like City or County departments and the relationship of the ED to both the Executive Committee and the Council are similar to a Town Board or County Commission.

It is the recommendation of the HC that the advertised salary range for this position be from \$85,000 up to \$120,000.

NORTHWEST COLORADO COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS JOB DESCRIPTION



GENERAL PURPOSE:

The Executive Director of the Northwest Colorado Council of Governments (NWCCOG) is appointed by and serves at the pleasure of the Northwest Colorado Council of Government's Council and its Executive Committee. Under general policy direction from the NWCCOG Executive Council, the Executive Director is responsible for the implementation of executive level administrative, supervisory, fiscal management decisions and to conduct the public relations duties associated with the day to day operations of the NWCCOG on behalf and for the benefit of its member organizations. The Executive Director will implement the policies and directives of the NWCCOG Council and Executive Committee through effective and efficient administration of the NWCCOG Departmental Organizations; providing enhanced communication between various echelons of the organization and the Council; the public; representation of the NWCCOG at the Federal, State, or local level; to provide highly responsible and responsive administrative support to the Council and Executive Committee and performance of other related duties as deemed necessary.

KEY CHALLENGE AND OBJECTIVE:

The core challenge for the Executive Director of the NWCCOG is to understand the shared concerns of member organizations and to build consensus around activities that can be jointly pursued in the future and to ensure the legitimacy value of the existing programs for the benefit of the entire organization.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

ADMINISTRATION:

- Direct, manage and implement the goals, programs, policies and priorities established and approved by the NWCCOG Board;
- Assist the NWCCOG Board in determining strategic long term plans and annual goals for the organization;
- Facilitate and develop the preparation and presentation of the annual NWCCOG budget for adoption by the NWCCOG Board and coordinate and implement the administration of the final adopted budget.
- Prepare Bi-monthly fiscal reports, policy reviews, or other studies as required and make presentations or have the appropriate staff make presentations to the Board regarding the status of implementation or action versus the stated or directed goals and objectives of such polices or programs;
- Coordinate the preparation of the NWCCOG meeting agendas and evaluate requested agenda items; inform the NWCCOG Board of pertinent items on agendas that require particular attention or concern; provide background information on matters being presented to them.

- Represent the NWCCOG in meetings with representatives from other jurisdictions, private industry and members of the public to respond to inquiries, resolve problems, negotiate agreements, and study potential changes which impact the NWCCOG Region;
- Respond to citizen complaints directly by gathering facts, determining solutions or referring to appropriate staff for corrective action;
- Maintain a public organizational presence in the press and communities of Region XII, and ensure ongoing, open and informative communications with the membership.
- Implement and monitor system of financial controls and reporting required for fiscal accountability to the Council, grantor agencies and other appropriate State and Federal offices.
- Responsible for supervision and management of annual audit and related issues such as identification and resolution of shared expenses.
- Negotiate contracts, agreements and present options on a variety of administrative, fiscal and special projects; analyze and prepare recommendations on special contract requests; monitor the administration of terms and conditions of all contracts or agreements with the NWCCOG and upon knowledge of any violation thereof, report the same to the NWCCOG Board;

MANAGEMENT:

- Provide leadership and direction to NWCCOG Department Heads to facilitate achievement of the NWCCOG goals and objectives; continuously monitor and evaluate the efficiency and effectiveness of NWCCOG service delivery methods and procedures;
- Supervise the activities of the departments assigned to the Executive Director; assess and monitor work load, monitor expenditures of annual budgets applicable to those departments under the direct control of the Executive Director, and monitor internal reporting relationships; coordinate department activities with other departments and agencies as needed; Identify opportunities for improvement and direct the implementation of changes;
- Coordinate and facilitate regularly scheduled meetings with NWCCOG Department Directors, to identify and resolve issues, act on opportunities and assign projects and programmatic areas of responsibility;
- Promote an amiable working environment, provide opportunities for board and staff development and identify and encourage opportunities for staff and board interaction;
- Assume full management responsibility for all assigned services and activities of the NWCCOG organization including but not limited to; All Human Resources processes and procedures including the responsibility for development and implementation of personnel policies and compensation schedules; and the responsibility for hiring, supervision, evaluation, compensation, coordination, development and discipline of staff;
- Maintain a close working relationship with each member jurisdiction, keeping members involved and informed on the programs and activities of the organization and on issues of regional concern.
- Responsible for membership relations including training, orientation and development of new board members and insure collection of at least 95% of annual dues;
- Assess member needs on an annual basis identify opportunities for intergovernmental cooperation, and report to members on the availability of resources and convey this information to staff and the Council;
- 4 Advise Council and staff on issues of legislative activity, regional cooperation and

related policy and programmatic opportunities and considerations, participate and interface with the legislative process as directed by the Council.

- Coordinate with other external organizations such as CCI, CML, CAST, Club 20 and the Governor's Cabinet as directed by the Council and as needed to coordinate NWCCOG programs, activities and resources.
- Act as a liaison between the NWCCOG Council, Elected Officials, staff and the public to disseminate information, directives and policies on behalf of the NWCCOG Board;
- Serve as the organizational representative to County Health Pool, Pinnacol Assurance, Mountain States Employers Council, CCOERA, NARC, CCI, CML and CAST and serving as a voting member to CIRSA;
- ✤ Coordinate the use of Legal Services with NWCCOG Counsel.
- Perform other job related duties and responsibilities as required and or assigned by the NWCCOG Board.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

Education and Experience

Bachelor's degree in Public Administration, Business Administration or a closely related field and a minimum of 5 years senior level management experience; experience in the public sector in Colorado is strongly encouraged. A master's degree is preferred however, related experience and/or training or combination of experience, training and education will be considered.

Working with the staffs of Health Care Policy and Finance and Department of Human Services on the logistics for the upcoming community forum on the Long-Term Services and Support Re-design. The forum will be held on Friday, February 3; 10:00 am-Noon; Summit Co. Community-Senior Center, Frisco. The proposed re-design regards the possible relocation of the Division of Developmental Disabilities, the State Unit on Aging and the Children's Residential Habilitation Program from the Department of Human Services to the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing. This move is being considered now in order to leverage federal health care reform dollars, to streamline our Long Term Care system and to improve services to clients. This forum is an opportunity for individuals and stakeholders to hear about the proposal and to provide input on this proposal.

Elevator Inspection Program - Gene Morse, Director

No report.

Energy Management (Weatherization) - Steve Getz, Director

December was a busy month for NWCCOG Weatherization. Energy Management Director Steve Getz and Field Supervisor Doug Jones traveled to the national Department of Energy (DOE) training conference in New Orleans, and attended workshops and training events while there. Steve Getz also presented two workshops on mobile home weatherization to attendees at the conference, one about mobile home floor insulation and the other about low-cost storm windows manufactured by NWCCOG. NWCCOG completed work on 26 homes in December despite interruptions for weather and the holidays; 185 homes have been weatherized since the July 1 2011 start of Weatherization's fiscal year.

December also marked the start of the weatherization of Holy Cross Village, a 60-unit affordable-housing apartment complex located in Gypsum, Colorado. Each of the apartments there will receive a new 95%-efficient forced air furnace, a programmable thermostat, additional attic insulation, and general work such as compact fluorescent light bulbs, door weatherstripping, water heater blankets, air sealing and insulation of attic ductwork, etc. Staff are averaging 2 furnace installations per day despite the cold weather. Work at Holy Cross Village will continue through January and February 2012.

On December 15, 2011, DOE Secretary Steven Chu announced that DOE had met the Stimulus (ARRA) goal of weatherizing 600,000 homes three months ahead of schedule. This had also been announced at the DOE training conference opening plenary. DOE has indicated savings realized by participants in the Weatherization program average 35%, generating \$320 million of energy savings per year. The Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) has been recognized as one of the top success stories of Stimulus – in addition to the 600,000 weatherized homes, at peak production the WAP was employing over 15,000 workers. In our region, the Weatherization program employs 27 full-time NWCCOG workers, as well as supporting staff of subcontractors, manufacturers, suppliers, etc. In November 2011 NWCCOG weatherized our 1,000th home since July 1 2009, the start of Stimulus production in Colorado. Also in December the DOE announced that states that haven't spent all their Stimulus (ARRA) funds will be given the opportunity to modify their original plans and extend the term of ARRA so that as many homes as possible can be weatherized. The Colorado Governor's Energy Office is currently analyzing the impacts of this decision to Colorado, and will announce their results no later than the annual Grant Guidance meeting scheduled for January 24 and 25, 2012.

Member Services – Rachel Lunney, Manager of Research Projects and Member Services

Member Services – 2011 Town of Silverthorne Community Survey has been completed. Results will be presented to the Silverthorne Town Council at their January 24th work session. Work has begun on creating demographic profiles for each member using current releases of Census 2010 data. This demographic information will be available on the website when completed. The January eNews will be emailed out on January 31st. Work has begun on the 2011 Annual Report which will be distributed to the NWCCOG Council at the March Council meeting, and will be available on the website (link will be provided on eNews which is distributed to all members, stakeholders, partners, etc.) Requests for data/research were received and responded to for the following members/stakeholders: Pitkin County, Granby Chamber of Commerce, Fraser, CMC. A survey was conducted on retirement plans in NWCCOG's region as well as CARO membership.

CARO – a draft CARO directory listing all regional organizations in the 14 regions in Colorado with contact information has been created and is being reviewed by CARO members. This will be a useful tool for the state legislature which is back in session as of January 11th. The next CARO meeting will be held in March (date TBD) in Canon City (Region 13 will host).

NWAHEMR – Liz Mullen, Homeland Security Coordinator

The NWAHEMR steering committee meets next on Wednesday, January 18, 2012 in Grand Junction. The 2008 re-issued funds to purchase Coroner radios have been spent; the radios have arrived and are being distributed. The contract for the 2009 re-issued funds to purchase radios for the municipal public works departments has been signed and sent to the state for their signature. The 2010 State Homeland Security Grant (SHSG) is nearly 75% complete and expires on 9/30/12. The 2011 SHSG contract has been received and we are beginning the projects funded through this grant. There is no information yet on a possible 2012 SHSG.

Northwest Loan Fund – June Walters, Director

The signed contract for the Forest Business Loan Fund was finally received, but without an amendment to include the infusion of another \$70,000 from the state severance tax fund. Staff is working to confirm the full amount for press release and workshops to be held throughout the 9-county loan fund territory in early February. Staff has already been working with its 1st Forest Business Loan Fund applicant in Gould, Jackson County.

Current and past members of the Northwest Loan Fund loan committee are being contacted to gauge their willingness to continue on as loan committee members with the added accountability for the Forest Business Loan Fund (nine county territory), Economic Development Administration Revolving Business Loan Funds (five NWCCOG county territory), USDA-Rural Development Intermediary Relending Program Funds (nine county territory) and all other funding resource programs from which NWCCOG loan programs may be capitalized. New loan committee members are being sought in Grand, Moffat, and Rio Blanco counties.

Contracts with Colorado Housing and Finance Authority to participate in its Green Colorado Credit Reserve and Garfield County's Credit Reserve programs are ready for execution by Director of the Northwest Loan Fund. These agreements create a loan loss reserve account, from origination fee collection and augmented with CHFA funds, to help mitigate the risk of lending to green start-up businesses in the ninecounty NLF territory. NWCCOG and EDD outreach/orientation meetings are being conducted, along with the Acting Executive Director, to member municipalities and counties.

ED and staff have also met with House Representative Hamner to assist in appropriate wording of legislation to use existing regional economic development organizations (existing COGs and EDDs) and the Colorado Association of Regional Councils to satisfy Governor Hickenlooper's objective of collaborating with bottom up regional economic development councils.

The status of the Small Business Development Center/Colorado Mountain College is uncertain at this time. The SBDC Director, Jack Taylor, was released from employment by CMC as of December 31, 2011. ED and staff has met with the Summit County Campus CEO, Alton Scales, to maintain/rejuvenate the continuing relationship in support of entrepreneurism and small business in whatever new form CMC adopts to ensure small business success in the NWCCOG and Northwest Loan Fund region.

Staff continues to serve on the NWCCOG council's Executive Director Hiring Committee – recommendations for position description, salary range and hiring process to be presented to the council at its January 26 meeting in Eagle.

Rural Resort Region (RRR)

In 2012, the Rural Resort Region (RRR) will coordinate their meetings with the Regional Coordinating Council (RCC). The next RCC/RRR meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, February 1, 2012 beginning at 10:00 a.m. in the Buffalo Mountain Room of the Summit County Commons Building in Frisco. The agenda topics will include the strengthening and formalizing the RCC structure and partnerships, review of the funding received in 2012, identifying the sources for the remaining required matching funds, and the development of a work plan with timeline. The RCC has been awarded \$10,000 from CDOT; \$130,000 for 24 months from the FTA for the Mobility Manager position; \$322,600 over 18 months from the FTA Veteran Affairs for the One Click/One Call hardware and software; and \$50,000 in FASTER funds, all to develop a regional call center to coordinate transportation for seniors, disabled adults, and veterans.
