Bi-national Water Leaders Exchange

- Reciprocal experience to share each other's work/concerns through the lens of leadership development
- Cohort of 16 participants from River Sister Cities, partner organizations and others by invitation
- Two 3-day sessions in 2018 Colorado River delta and headwaters
- Blend components of CFWE's Water Leaders and Water Fluency
- Sessions on local water management framework, current issues, innovative projects (e.g. Delta Water Trust, Colorado Water Trust)
- Site Visits (e.g. Laguna Grande restoration site tour, proposed river park site tour, system conservation work sites in CO)





Bi-national Water Leaders Exchange Desired Outcomes

- Develop outstanding, multi-year program
- Build bi-national network of committed leaders with mutual interests
- Improve efficacy of leadership
- Ultimately improve outcomes for the Colorado River, source to sea


